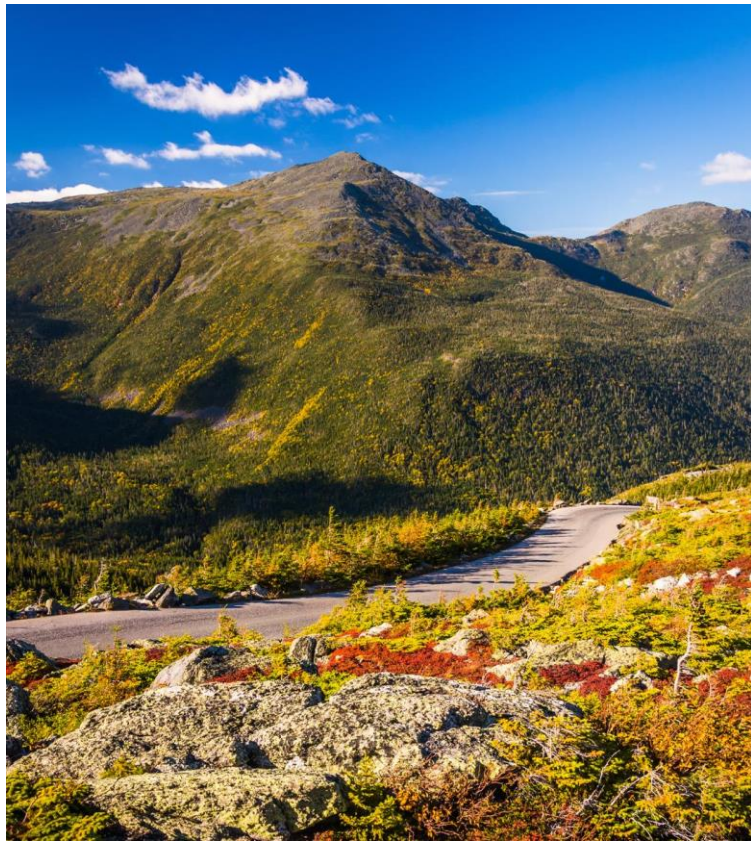

Day 1: Saturday, October 2, 2027 Boston, Massachusetts

Welcome to Massachusetts, where your journey through charming and vibrant New England begins. Due to varied arrival times, you have no scheduled activities today. Discover Boston as you wish.

Day 2: Sunday, October 3, 2027 Boston - Woodstock, Vermont - Essex Junction

This morning, set out for Vermont where tree-covered mountainsides dot a charming landscape of quaint villages with traditional, white steeple churches. Visit Quechee Gorge — known as Vermont's Little Grand Canyon. This afternoon, watch glassblowing artisans craft unique art at the Simon Pearce flagship store. Savor a private lunch prepared with fresh, local ingredients served on Simon Pearce dinnerware. After lunch, arrive in Woodstock, “the quintessential New England village,” with its beautifully restored Georgian homes, a covered bridge, and even a town green. This evening, settle in at your comfortable Vermont resort, a property with a rich culinary heritage, and once home to a renowned cooking school. Before gathering for a welcome dinner, enjoy a chef-led culinary demonstration that introduces the resort's food-focused roots and celebrates the flavors of the region. (B, L, D)

Day 3: Monday, October 4, 2027 Essex Junction - Shelburne - Burlington - Essex Junction

Begin your day with a guided tour of the Shelburne Museum, founded by visionary collector Electra Havemeyer Webb, whose passion for American art and design shaped this remarkable institution. Discover an eclectic range of exhibits, including folk art, quilts, historic carriages, and landmark structures such as a light house and vintage steamboat. After learning the story behind the museum's collections and historic buildings, enjoy free time to explore the galleries that most interest you. Continue to Burlington's vibrant Church Street Marketplace, where you'll enjoy free time for lunch on your own and the opportunity to explore local shops, cafés, and street performers in this lively pedestrian district. Tonight, dine at a local eatery known for its farm-to-table philosophy, where a seasonal menu highlights locally sourced ingredients. (B, D)

Day 4: Tuesday, October 5, 2027 Essex Junction - Bretton Woods, New Hampshire

Today you will be New Hampshire bound! Soak in the lovely New England countryside as you journey east to the White Mountains. Along the way, sample a fall favorite – an apple cider donut – while passing through the charming village of Stowe. Stop to explore the Rocks Estate, home to the North Country Conservation & Education Center. On a tour of the farm, learn about the history and importance of maple sugaring in the region and visit a virtual tap room. Enjoy free time for lunch in the charming town of Littleton before making your way to the historic Omni Mount Washington for a 2-night stay. Discover this iconic hotel where world-class amenities and grand architecture await. The property has hosted the likes of Thomas Edison, Winston Churchill, and several U.S. presidents. (B, D)

Day 5: Wednesday, October 6, 2027 Bretton Woods

After breakfast, make your way to Mount Washington* — the highest peak in the Northeastern United States. Break into smaller groups and enjoy an exclusive tour up the twisting Auto Road. Take in the sight of the peaks jutting into the sky alongside a local expert who will teach you about the unique history, plant, and animal life you may see along the way. Once you reach the summit, take time to appreciate the fantastic view and spend some time inside the museum to learn about the extreme, rapid changing weather conditions that impact the mountain's peak. Enjoy free time in North Conway for lunch before driving the Kancamagus Highway, a scenic byway offering spectacular views of the White Mountains region. (B, D)

Day 6: Thursday, October 7, 2027 North Conway -

Lake Winnepesaukee - Portland, Maine Journey to New Hampshire's picturesque lakes region, a popular vacation spot for visitors year-round. Cruise across Lake Winnepesaukee as fiery autumn colors reflect off the water, creating a classic New England panorama. Then, visit the charming town of Wolfeboro, the "oldest summer resort in America." Later, travel to Maine's

seacoast. Drive through the seaside community of Kennebunkport. See Walker's Point, the home on a rocky promontory that's a summer residence to the family of the late President George H.W. Bush. This evening, arrive in Portland, once home to sea captains and now known as one of "America's coolest cities." (B)

Day 7: Friday, October 8, 2027 Portland This morning, a locally guided tour includes Fort Williams Park to view the Portland Head Light, the most photographed lighthouse in America and the oldest in Maine. As you take in the views of Portland Harbor and Casco Bay, four more lighthouses can be seen. Enjoy some free time this afternoon in beautiful Portland to stroll the historic Old Port neighborhood's many shops and restaurants. Or perhaps check out one of the city's many museums or historical sites. Tonight, join your fellow travelers for a very special farewell dinner celebrating the flavors of coastal Maine, where lobster is a regional highlight. (B, D)

Day 8: Saturday, October 9, 2027 Portland - Boston, Massachusetts - Tour Ends Today, return to the Boston airport with the many wonderful memories of your adventure. (B)

The overall activity level of this tour is a level 1. This means you're a leisurely traveler. You typically take it easy and discover the energy of a new place by people-watching or soaking in the atmosphere at a local café. You can climb at least one flight of stairs, board a coach, and walk unassisted at a relaxed pace for up to 60 minutes without difficulty. You can easily handle altitudes up to 5,000 feet.

Travel with an average of 37 people (maximum of 44).

Set across 45 acres, the Shelburne Museum features over 30 distinctive buildings. Enjoy plenty of time to explore at your leisure, with a continuously operating shuttle available to assist guests with mobility concerns.

If you require any special assistance while on tour, please make us aware at the time of reservation so the necessary request form can be sent to your attention.

We will reach altitudes of over 6,000 feet at the top of Mount Washington. If you have issues with altitude, you can elect to sit this activity out.

Personal audio devices (headsets) are not included on this tour.

*The Mount Washington Auto Road may be closed due to weather conditions. If this happens on your departure, you will experience an alternative version of this inclusion.

Single accommodations are limited and are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Single rate subject to change based on availability.

To complete your tour, we include round-trip airport-to-hotel transfers when purchasing our airfare with your tour. If you have arranged for your own air, we are pleased to provide you the option of *purchasing* these transfers. Please note that all transfers will leave at pre-scheduled times.

For air-inclusive reservations, the name provided at time of booking must match your government-issued ID that will be used during travel. Name changes are subject to penalties.
